Veteran finally receives headstone

*For more than 75 years,
John Conway's grave was unmarked*

The graveyard in St. Bride's has rows and rows of headstones, some new and others old and worn.

This summer, a new headstone was erected — nothing out of the ordinary, except for the fact that the person whose grave it marks died in 1932.

It is the resting place of First World War veteran Pte. John Conway, who served in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

The engraving on the stone reads: "John Conway, Private, Royal Nfld. Regt. WW1. 1888-1932. Lest We Forget."

Aloysius Power, a retired counsellor with the Department of Veterans Affairs, was one of the people who helped get the headstone erected.

"The process began after I had a discussion with the late Stan Conway of St. Bride's about the World Wars," Power said.

"It was through him that I learned of the unmarked grave. It took about a year from the time I made some phone calls until the headstone was installed."

With the co-operation of the St. Bride's parish, the help of St. Bride's resident Anthony Lundrigan, the Last Post Fund and Muir's Marble Works, the stone was erected with a Canadian flag at its side.

"The day that it was installed, I had a great sense of satisfaction. It is important for a veteran to have a marked grave, as that is the least we owe them," Power said.

After working with Veterans Affairs for 30 years, and being raised in Branch, where veterans were held in high esteem, Power says he couldn't let this veteran's grave stay unmarked.

"He had been dead for over 70 years and now he is finally being recognized," he said.

Power retired in 1993, but he's still an active advocate for veterans.

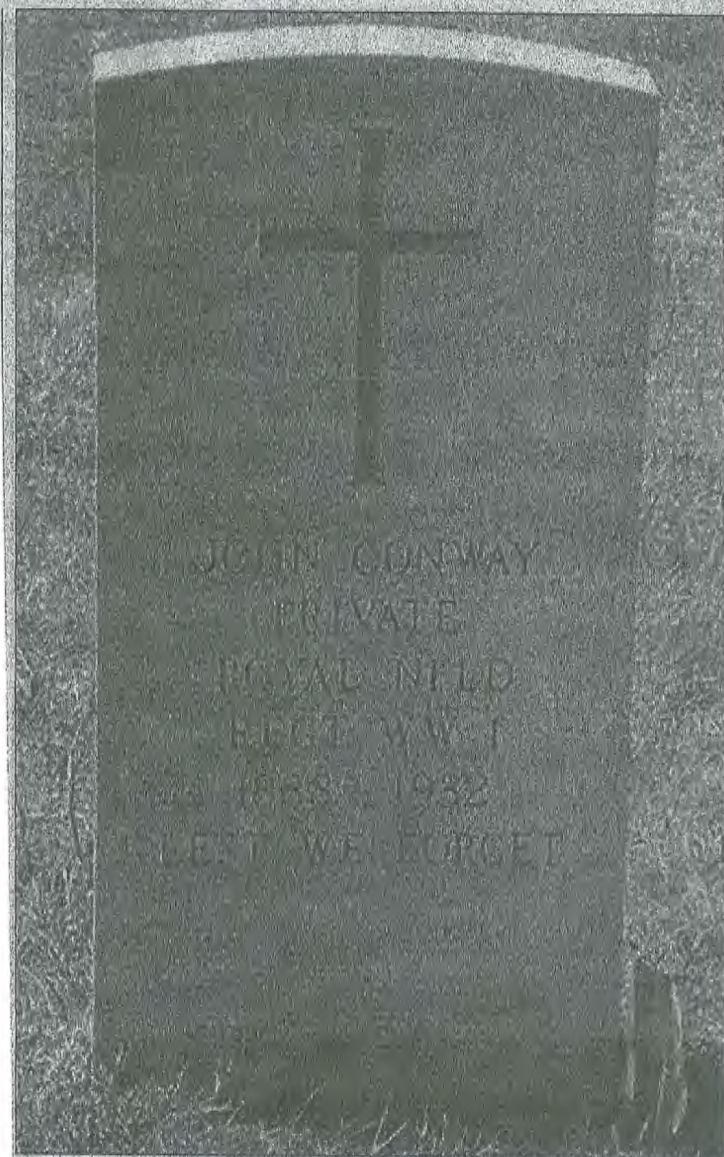
"I have often put flags on a veteran's grave in Branch, Point Lance and St. Bride's. Even though I am retired, I am still helping veterans, because it has become a part of my life."

When he worked with Veterans Affairs, Power visited veterans in their homes, advised them and let them know about available benefits.

"For their sacrifice, the least we owe a veteran is a proper resting place," he says.

Stephen Price (18) lifted in the 60 KG class, took home a bronze medal with a 210 KG (462 lbs) squat and another bronze with a deadlift of 212.5 KG (468 lbs), benched 100 KG (220 lbs) and finished 4th overall. Stephen also set 2 Canadian national records and 6 Newfoundland records.

Stacey Price (20). Although Stacey did not medal, she did maintain her 8th overall ranking in the world. Stacey squat 142.5 KG (314 lbs), bench pressed 87.5 KG (193 lbs) and deadlifted 120 KG (264 lbs). Stacey set an amazing 8 provincial records during her competition.

Justin Miller (20) lifted in the 75 KG class and captured a bronze Medal with a squat of 290 KG (638 lbs) and silver medal in bench Press with a lift of 202.5 KG (446 lbs), deadlifted 260 (572 lbs) and captured bronze overall with a 3 lift total of 752.5 KG (1656 lbs). Justin's squat broke a 19 year old Canadian squat record and set another 2 national records along with a staggering 8 provincial records.
